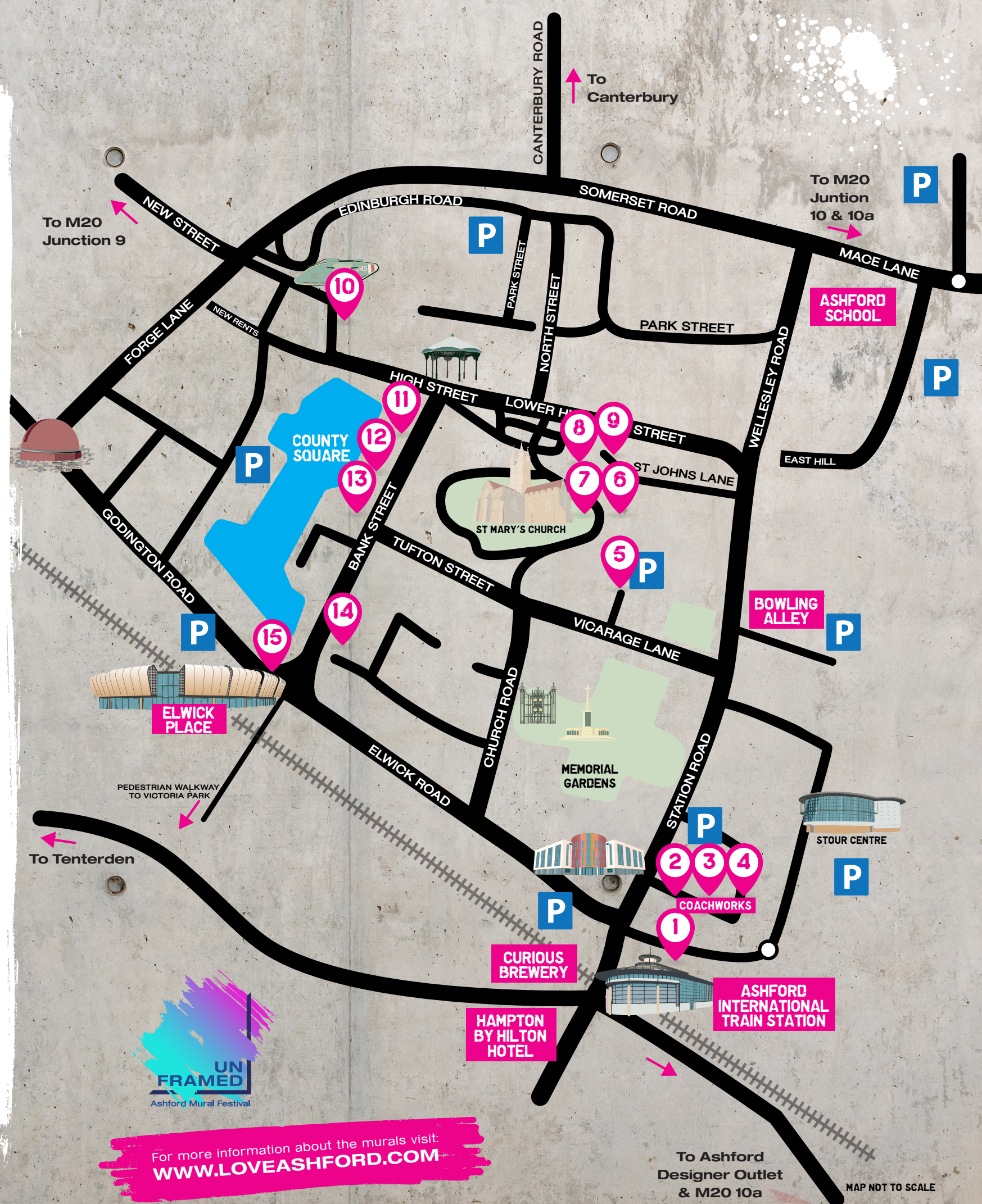


ARTISTS AND LOCATIONS

- 1 A Fish Out of Ashford**
Leah Bunting & Claudia Otto, Students from Ashford College
Planters, outside Ashford International Station, TN23 1EZ
Inspired by the movement of Ashford as a transport hub, and the flow of the Great Stour River running through town, this mural by Ashford College Students is a partnership with Ashford Station & Kent Community Rail Partnership
- 2 A Town In Motion**
by Will Barras
Underneath International House, Dover Place, TN23 1HU
Artist, illustrator, and animation director Will Barras was a founding member of the Scrawl collective, known for capturing fluid movement through distinctive line work and narrative-driven compositions. In this piece, he turns his attention to Ashford and the wider borough, weaving together recognisable urban and rural landscapes.
- 3 Traverse**
The London Mural Company x Accent London
Coachworks Front Windows, Dover Place TN23 1HU
Colourful painted wheel tracks travel across the windows giving a historic nod to this former Croford Coachbuilders paint store. This bold design now represents a new kind of creativity, collaboration and crossover that now takes place here and links to Coachworks brand by resident designers Tiny Dog Creative.
- 4 The One Round The Back Of Coachworks***
ODISY
Coachworks courtyard, Dover Place TN23 1HU
A notable part of London's graffiti and street art movement since the early '90s, with exhibitions and sell out shows across the UK, Europe and USA, ODISY brings his complex style of interwoven characters and objects to the space to represent Coachworks' fusion of work and play
- 5 Ashford Icons**
Danielle Williamson (Tinybeegle)
Storage container, Vicarage Lane Car Park, TN23 1NU
Ashford-based illustrator and designer brings us her mural montage of iconic people and places connected to the borough including Queen Marie of Romania and Simone Weil. All the reasons and more why we Love Ashford!
- 6 Too big for your boots**
Alex Chinneck
Back of former Odeon Cinema, St Johns Lane TN23 1PS
Best known for bending, melting and unzipping buildings from Margate to Milan, artist Alex Chinneck's mural for Ashford is a world first. Chinneck's 10m high laces create the illusion of fluidity in a typically inflexible material, as they appear to unlace the vast brick wall!
- 7 High Octane**
Charley Peters
Vicarage Lane Car Park, St Johns Lane TN23 1PS
Capturing the energy of Ashford's developing cultural profile and its rich commuter tradition, High Octane is a positive, powerful artwork using strong colour and implied trajectory to animate the wall and surrounding area.

- 8 Sam**
Voyder
Side of former Odeon building, St Johns Lane TN23 1PS
Famed world-wide for his work that explores the juxtaposition of classical painting and graffiti, Voyder depicts the Ashford Borough based artist Sam (Mr Doodle) in his trademark doodle suit, preparing his ink, with iconic buildings in the background such as Charter House, Willesborough Windmill, and St Mildred's Church, where he got married.
- 9 The Ash Tree by Aspire**
Aspire
Odeon hoardings, St Johns Lane TN23 1PS
Aspire's street art birds and pixels can be found around many corners of the UK and across the world. In Ashford, this work explores the town's natural beauty and its connection to the ash tree within the urban landscape.
- 10 Lithest, Gaudiest Harlequin!**
Will Redgrove
Pilgrims Hospices, 4 Castle Street TN23 1JQ
Blue Tits and a ribbon in flight within a field of Bluebells, Forget-Me-Nots and Sunflowers. A meaningful and peaceful representation of everlasting love, gratitude, respect, memory and care, which, at its heart, is Ashford based Pilgrims Hospices vision.
- 11 Flamboyant Fawn**
Curtis Hylton
Bucksford Law, 2a Bank Street TN23 1BX
UK and internationally renowned artist Curtis Hylton creates a sense of peacefulness and tranquillity, as if the viewer has stumbled upon a quiet moment in the natural world.
- 12 Proud Peacock, Bahar Flowers**
Curtis Hylton
2d Bank Street TN23 1BX
Curtis returned a year later to create this majestic peacock in contrast to the stag. Its vibrant plumage spreading across the wall, symbolising the town's metamorphosis and the flourishing artistic community here. The flowered feathers represents the beautiful tulips Curtis spotted in Salata, a local café who's owner Bahar kept the artist fuelled up on good coffee during the week of him painting.
- 13 Loose Ends 206**

28 Bank Street, TN23 1BA
A mix of feelings, stories and expression all collide in this vivid collage of dynamic shape, form and rainbow colour. It amplifies the stories of shared human connection in our ever-changing world. A bright and bold piece for Bright City Church, and for the amazing work they do.
- 14 Tales of the High Lock***
Hatch
Low Key Taproom, 39-41 Bank Street TN23 1DQ
A montage of miscellaneous madness that negates the need for narrative and instead initiates both intrigue and indecision.
- 15 Love Film***
Chris Page
Cinema, Elwick Road TN23 1AE
A celebration of the silver screen and its drive for pinpoint picture quality and definition through the ages as technology progresses. Hidden within the mural is the message of 'Love'.
